



Gala Committee Mailing over 7,500 Announcements For June, 2006 Event

Gala expected to have over 1000 in attendance

In Late October, the Gala committee will be mailing out the formal invitations and announcements for the event to over 7,500 alumnus who have registered with the Association and have addresses on file. A final push is underway to complete a registration drive for those who have not yet registered with the Association at www.justinfkimball.org.

Every graduate from 1960 to 2005 is listed in the Classmate Directory and the registration is free and private. The classmate directory is owned by the Alumni Association and never allows the information to be used by anyone individual or organization except for official Association business. An Alumni's personal contact information can be marked "private" if they wish but only Justin F Kimball graduates are allowed to register.

Registration is simple. If you haven't registered yet just click this link <http://www.justinfkimball.org/database/register.php> and complete the form. Afterwards, you will receive a confirming email with your user name and password to allow you to complete your personal profile and to search the directory for others.

The directory is important for all classes when it is time for a reunion of their class. Reunion committees turn to the Alumni Association to reach all classmates with the announcements and if you contact information is not up to date, you will miss out on attending.

Also, the Alumni Association needs your support and involvement. The June, 2006 Gala Event will be the first gathering of Association Alumni and election of new members of the Board of Governors to guide us for the next 2 to 4 years. In addition to members of the Board of Governors, all classes will have a class representative to contact for any request or need. Information and registration to attend the Gala can be found on the Gala website at www.kimballalumni-gala.org.

Don't forget that the Alumni Association is a tax exempt charitable educational organization and all outright donations to the Association or its events are tax deductible. Donations for attending the Gala are \$75.00 per person with \$50.00 of it tax deductible and can be taken this year if paid before December 31, 2005.

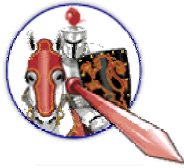

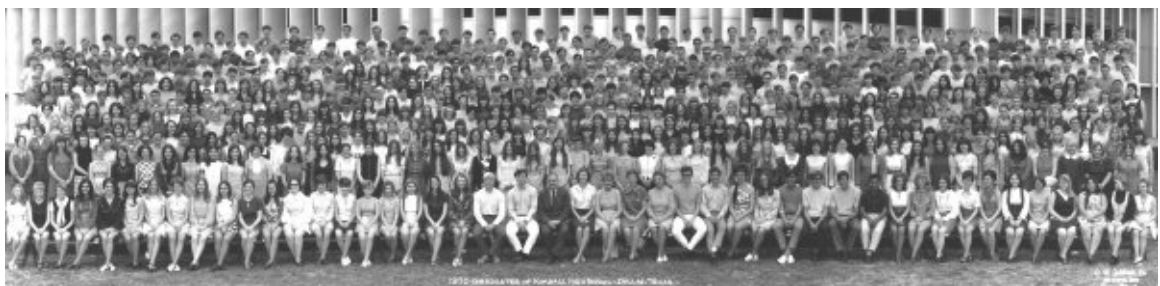

This campaign will be constantly before all alumni this year, as it will take each one of us to find and bring them home.

Finding the lost alumni:

First, check your class lost list and discover who is missing. Then forward any information to webmaster@justinfkimball.org so that we can follow up and verify.

Secondly, if each of us would use the Internet for one hour a week looking up the lost alumni, it would help a great deal. Using the Internet white pages or search engines like Google, Yahoo, Anywho are the best places to start. Also, you can enter "Kimball High" or "Justin F Kimball" into the search engines and anyone on the Internet who has reference to the school on a page will be shown.

Thirdly, can provide a clue as to where to start? Maybe make a call to parents who still live in the same location. Call another classmate who was friends with a lost classmate and ask them if they are still in touch.

Fourthly, in the case of female graduates, do you know of their married name?

And, finally, if you are a Gold member of Classmates.com, you can send up to 50 emails a day to alumni who are not registered or lost to the Association.

Building our database of registered alumni is crucial to future successes of class reunions and to know if any of our classmates have passed away. Please be vigilant in helping us complete this work.

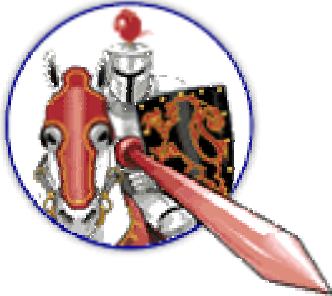
In Memoriam

Kimball also suffered the loss of former Band Director, Ed Estes. Ed was born in Quanah, Texas and departed this earth June 14, 2005. He is survived by Frances, his wife of 52 years; a nephew, Dick Estes; niece, Elizabeth Baldwin; aunt, Alice Cameron; cousins, Celia Cameron and Trish Yeates, Jan Staffileno and many friends. He was a member of Casa View United Methodist Church. He played clarinet and saxophone. During World War II, he was stationed in Alaska performing with the 38th Special Service Company. Being a musician of the "Big Band Era", he toured with many big bands; Freddy Nagel, Charlie Agnew and Clyde McCoy. He attended college at Texas Tech, UTA and graduated from Texas Christian University in 1952. He was a band director in McKinney and in Dallas ISD at Boude Storey Junior High, Kimball High School and J. L. Long Middle School. Along with his teaching, he played with numerous Dallas dance bands: Winston Barney, Mal Fitch, Jimmy Jay, Sandy Sandifer, Joe Reichman, Charlie Patterson and his own band, the Ed Estes Orchestra. He was an avid golfer and oil-painting artist with a sense of humor and a gift of getting to the bottom-line truth of matters.
